What is domestic violence?

Domestic violence is the abuse of one partner within an intimate or family relationship. It is the repeated, random and habitual use of intimidation to control. The abuse can be physical, emotional, psychological, financial or sexual.

Abusive behaviour can occur in any relationship. It can continue even after the relationship has ended. Both men and women can be abused or abusers.

Witnessing domestic abuse is child abuse when seen by young people. Teenagers can suffer domestic abuse in their peer relationships.
